2016 SYNAPSE RESIDENCY PROGRAM – GUIDELINES

The Australian Network for Art & Technology (ANAT) is calling for applications from artists and scientists for the prestigious Synapse Residency program. The program is a core element of the Synapse initiative, which, since 2004, has supported collaboration between artists and scientists.

ABOUT SYNAPSE

Synapse supports creative partnerships between artists and scientists through a residency program, a database of international art/science collaborations <<u>www.synapse.net.au</u>>, and through the Australian Research Council (ARC) Linkage program, which supports longer-term partnerships between artists and scientists in academic research settings.

2016 SYNAPSE RESIDENCIES

Residencies are available for **Australian artists** working in any artform. Australian-based residencies shall take place over 16 weeks full-time (or part-time equivalent) during the 2016 calendar year.

To ensure a fit between the artist/s and host organisation/s, a joint application must be submitted. It is the responsibility of the project partners to establish contact and to identify the focus of the proposed collaboration prior to application. Those with existing relationships are encouraged to apply.

As the residencies have a creative research focus it is not expected that they will result in the production of new work. Residencies may also be approached as a platform to test and inform a longer-term research project suitable for submission to the ARC Synapse Linkage program.

ANAT will pay participating artists a fee of \$800 (AUD) per week and materials costs. Accommodation, living away from home allowances and return travel to the destination of the residency will also be covered if required. The host organisation is to provide in-kind access to staff, equipment, space and resources, as well as contributing - if possible - a small amount of cash towards the cost of disseminating outcomes at the conclusion of the residency (for example, through a publication, seminar, exhibition, etc).

Tertiary students, including PhD candidates, are ineligible to apply if the proposed residency in any way contributes to the achievement of an academic qualification. If you are unsure about this requirement, please contact us to discuss your particular circumstances.

The selection criteria comprises:

- Originality and innovation of the proposed project;
- Artist/s professional track-record and their familiarity with the proposed area of inquiry;
- Demonstrated willingness by all parties to work collaboratively;
- Anticipated benefits accruing to both the artist and the host organisation.

HOW TO APPLY

This is a highly competitive program. As such, we strongly recommend that you discuss your proposal with us prior to application (contact details are provided below).

Please submit the following, via email, in your application:

- 1. Completed and signed Application Cover Sheet (attached)
- 2. TWO-PAGE Proposal, which includes:
 - a. A description of the proposed project;
 - b. Detail about how each project partner expects to benefit from the residency;
 - c. A description of the artist/s practice and previous collaboration/s with science partners;
 - d. A description of the host organisation, including any previous experience working with artists.
- 3. ONE-PAGE Budget

The host organisation's cash and in-kind contributions must be negotiated prior to application and included in the submitted budget. An example budget is available to guide applicants - please contact us to receive a copy of the template.

- 4. Support material no more than TWO of the following:
 - Four images in digital format
 - Four minutes of video (URL only)
 - Four minutes of audio (URL only)
 - One interactive work
 - Four URLs

Select support material that best demonstrates your artistic practice.

5. Summary CV's (no more than TWO pages EACH) of the artist/s and the principal collaborating scientist/researcher from the host organisation.
