Do you feel as though your practice could benefit with some **breathing** space? Would you consider your arts practice and a residency at the Australian Wine Research Institute a great **blend**?

The Australian Network for Art & Technology (ANAT) is excited to announce a new art + science residency in partnership with the Australian Wine Research Institute (AWRI), based in Adelaide.

The AWRI is the Australian grape and wine industry's research organisation. It supports a sustainable and successful grape and wine industry through world-class research, practical solutions and knowledge transfer. The AWRI will host the residency at the Wine Innovation Cluster based in Urrbrae, Adelaide, with the successful artist to work with the <u>flavour chemistry and sensory research</u> teams, led by Dr Leigh Francis.

Residency details

The residency will take place between April and December 2019 in Adelaide, South Australia over 12 weeks fulltime (or part-time equivalent). ANAT will pay an artist fee of \$800 per full-time week (or part-time pro-rata equivalent) and a modest contribution towards project materials. The AWRI's contribution to the residency is substantial and includes research staff, facilities, materials and the provision of an external sensory panel and consumer study.

In the event the successful artist does not reside in Adelaide, independent accommodation is available at the <u>Gosse International Student Residence</u>, which is within walking distance of the AWRI. ANAT will cover the artist's travel, accommodation and living away from home expenses in this case. Please see the residency budget section for details.

Who can apply?

The residency is open to Australian artists working in any art form.

Applicants should note the residency strongly encourages a creative research focus, with artists dissuaded from anticipating specific outcomes at the onset. As such, the residency is not expected to directly result in the production of new work.

Tertiary students, including PhD candidates, are ineligible to apply if the proposed residency in any way contributes to the achievement of their academic qualification. Contact us if you are unsure.

Selection Criteria

- Artist's professional track-record
- Proposed project focus in relation to wine flavour and sensory research.

Background

Since 2004, ANAT has brought artists and scientists together in <u>research partnerships</u> that have generated new knowledge, ideas and processes beneficial to both fields.

Residencies have involved Australian science organisations hosting artists in situ, leading to profound artistic and professional development for the participants, as well as building a sustainable support base for interdisciplinary creative collaboration in Australia.

HOW TO APPLY

1. **Discuss your project proposal with AWRI** This is to ensure your project will be a good fit with AWRI's research team. Contact details below.

2. Submit the following:

- a. Completed and signed Application Cover Sheet (attached)
- b. ONE-PAGE Proposal, which includes:
 - A description of the proposed research
 - A statement about how the artist expects to benefit from the residency
- c. Completed ONE-PAGE Budget: (attached)
- d. Summary Artist's CV (no more than TWO pages)
- e. Support material provide no more than TWO of the following:
 - Up to four images in digital format (no greater than 1mb each)
 - Up to four minutes of video (URL only)
 - Up to four minutes of audio (URL only)
 - One interactive work (URL only)
 - Up to four URLs that demonstrate your practice
